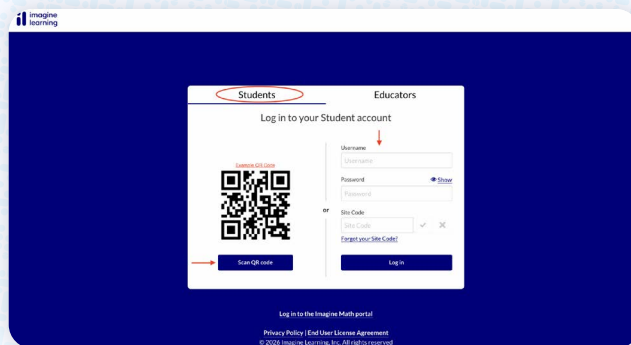

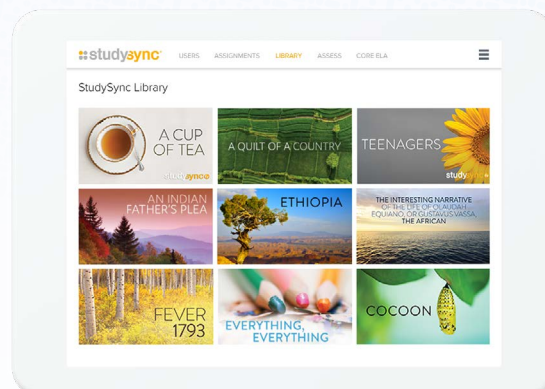

How to Support Learning at Home

- Encourage your student to discuss what they are reading and writing. Ask questions such as:

 - What writing assignment are you working on?
 - What was the most interesting thing you learned this week?
