## Your student's experience in Imagine+ Assessment

To set students up, teachers will show them how to log in and begin. For younger learners (K–1), an interactive orientation will introduce the testing tools and show how to answer different question types.

## About the tests

During the school year, your student may take one or more of these tests:

### Imagine+ Diagnostics

Imagine+ Diagnostics assess each student's abilities and instructional grade level in English language arts (ELA) and math for grades K–12. These tests adjust to your student's skill level, offering a personalized experience that pinpoints their instructional needs. Diagnostics include 30–45 questions and take about 45–60 minutes to complete, with younger students (K–1) often finishing in shorter sessions.

### Imagine+ Screener

The Imagine+ Screener is an early literacy test for PreK–3 students that measures foundational reading skills and flags potential challenges like dyslexia. The results give teachers insights to guide instruction and provide timely support. Developed by experts at Boston Children's Hospital and the Florida Center for Reading Research, it's a trusted tool for early literacy support. The Screener includes 30–45 questions and takes about 45–60 minutes to complete, with younger students (PreK–1) often finishing in shorter sessions.

### Imagine+ Formatives

The Imagine+ Formatives are designed to support daily classroom instruction and intervention. Developed by assessment experts for ELA and math in Grade K–8, they're short tests consisting of 5–10 questions.
